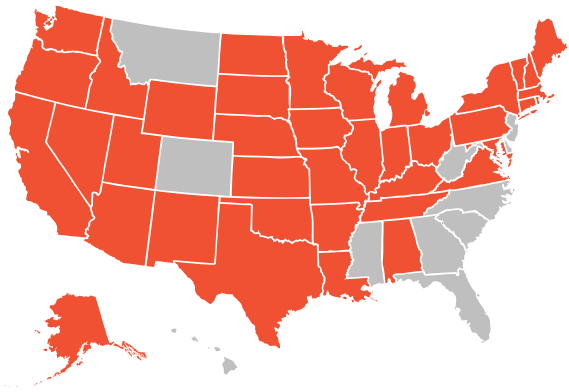
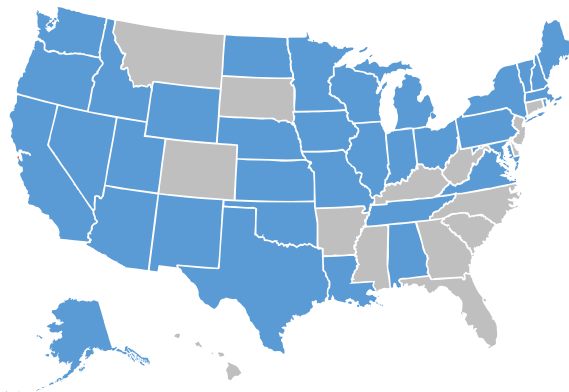


FIREFIGHTER CANCER LEGISLATION

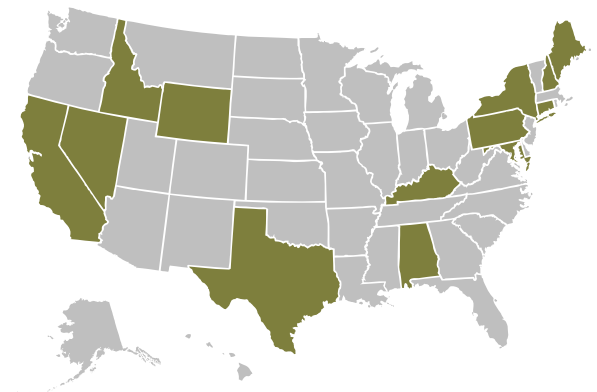
Firefighter cancer presumption laws allow firefighters to file for workers' compensation if they are diagnosed with occupational cancer. Some states offer firefighters, and their families, other forms of compensation – such as enhanced retirement/pension benefits or death/disability benefits – if they are diagnosed with cancer and meet the state's requirements. Laws vary in each of the 39 states.



39 states with cancer legislation for firefighters



35 states with a true firefighter cancer presumption law for firefighter.



13 states with laws explicitly covering volunteer firefighters.
