EMMS 170A: EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN I: BASIC TRAINING

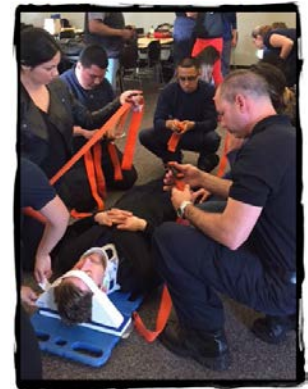


Techniques of emergency medical care designed to meet the State of California Requirements for certification of EMT-1 (ambulance) personnel. Emergency Medical Technician Basic Training designed to meet Department of Transportation, National Registry of EMTs, and State of California requirements for certification as an EMT-Basic (Ambulance) crew member.

The Emergency Medical Technician course (EMMS 170A) is offered twice a semester. The course schedule consists of either Monday and Wednesday or Tuesday and Thursday nights from 6PM to 10PM

EMMS 170B: EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN I: BASIC TRAINING APPLICATION

Participation includes a ride along with a local ambulance provider, patient observation in the hospital setting and preparation for the National Registry skills and written test. Hours are by arrangement.



Once you graduate from the EMT program, you will be eligible to apply to take the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) and apply for state EMT certification.

****Students are required to provide proof of cleared criminal background, drug screen and current vaccinations.**

EMMS 170A & EMMS 170B are a two-course co-requisite program and must be taken concurrently.
