Structure Ignition Potential assessment will be better prepared to conduct community assessments that will fulfill the requirements of the Firewise Communities/USA® Recognition program.

In a learning environment that encourages discussion and interaction, sessions are taught by wildland fire specialists who understand how and why homes and communities are destroyed during wildfire events and the simple things that residents can do to minimize property loss.
