Attributes of Leading is the latest delivery from the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation in assisting America's fire service with its need for leadership and officer development.

What are the Attributes of Leading?

The current version of the workshop offers these twelve AOLs: Developing Competence Constructive Influence Building Grit Developing Humility Having Presence Resilience Self-Mastery Exercising Self-Regulation Stepping Up Building Trust Vigilance Being Well

What does the day look like?

The participants select the attributes based on consensus at the outset of the day. With strong timing and quick breaks, most groups get to two attributes in one 8-hour day. Each attribute starts with a short video which acts as a springboard to get the thought process and discussion rolling.

What's the process?

The NFFF staff work these sessions as facilitators rather than instructors. They guide the discussions, keep the timelines, and strive to get the group to collaborate and come to consensus. The workshop is normally held with the room set up in horseshoe fashion so everyone can see each other for effective face-to-face discussion. Small group break-out sessions are also part of the day. Each participant gets a series of Tactical Work Sheets for note taking, emphasizing what to keep doing, stop doing and start doing. These sheets can be used as a template to develop a plan moving forward.
